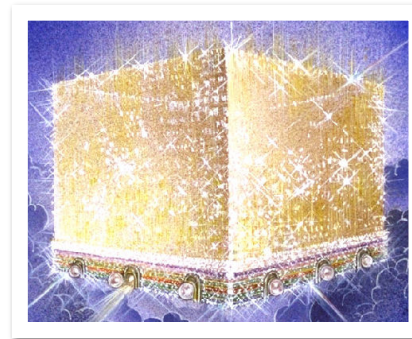

sexual advance from another man's wife... Is anyone starting to see a pattern?



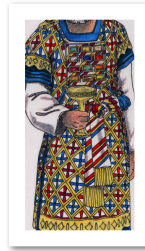

And Shem and Japheth took a **garment**, and laid it upon both their shoulders, and went backward, and covered the nakedness of their father; and their faces were backward, and they saw not their father's nakedness.

Remembering our Brethren

John Claess(plash) (1544) Not yet four years old in The Lord he was told to recant his anabaptist belief, that baptism is for adults and not infants. He urged his wife to forget her sensualities and carnal desires towards him and told his children to associate with only the ones who fear The Lord, who depart from evil and do every good thing through love... this he wrote from prison. He stood in front of four judges of the romanish persuasion (murderers got seven judges), they pronounced him guilty of teaching people false doctrine and new opinions. As John went out the court he said, "You citizens bear witness that we die for no other reason than for the Word of God." **His head was placed on a stake and his body on the wheel** as food for birds and wild beasts along with an eighty seven year old brother in The Lord simply named "grandfather". This they did defying the religion of the day and the law of the land.
